Bachelor of Health Science (Nutritional Medicine)

The **Southern School of Natural Therapies (SSNT)** offers a small range of courses including the ***Bachelor of Health Science (Nutritional Medicine)***. The study of Nutritional Medicine looks at how nutrition impacts health, the relationship between diet and disease, as well as a developing an understanding of how nutritional, dietary and lifestyle factors impact wellbeing through the lifespan.

Nutritional Medicine combines food as medicine traditions and dietary therapy with recent scientific advances in nutritional biochemistry and therapeutics, which are now used by conventional and holistic practitioners alike.

Career as a Podiatrist

The **Good Universities Guide** states that *Podiatrists look after the health of people's feet by diagnosing, treating and preventing foot abnormalities, and educating the public about good foot health. Podiatrists may develop a special interest in dealing with particular client groups, such as children, the aged or sportspeople. They may also work in a particular area, such as occupational health, or with general medical conditions that result in foot and leg problems.*

In Victoria, one university offers a bachelor course in podiatry, and that is La Trobe University. La Trobe offers the Bachelor of Applied Science: 2.5 years' minimum duration, and the Master of Podiatric Practice: 1.5-year minimum duration.

VCE prerequisites are Units 3 and 4: a study score of at least 30 in English (EAL) or at least 25 in English other than EAL; Units 3 and 4: a study score of at least 25 in two of Biology, Chemistry, any Mathematics, Physical Education or Physics.

Subject bonuses include a study score of 30 in any Mathematics, Physical Education or any Science equals 4 aggregate points per study. A study score of 25 in Health and Human Development equals 4 aggregate points. A study score of 20 in any LOTE equals 4 aggregate points per study. Overall maximum of 12 points.
